I don't disable consent for calls.

I only turned off video calls today. The kids feel pressured when asked to "show you" rooms of my house at your request, as happened to Lucy yesterday. Until she is able to recover from that, and again feel comfortable that phone calls are just for talking, we can just do audio calls. For Lucy, stress can manifest as wanting to control various things, such as where her brother is allowed to sit or whether she can touch things they've touched, and on today's call, I was unable to get the support I hoped for in guiding Lucy through the control issue she was experiencing.

The three of them have been making big progress in how they interact with one another... they really have. I don't want to compromise that or take steps backward.
